At the St. Gaudens National Historical Site, an entrance fee of \$5 is charged for visitors age 16 and over, but **America the Beautiful Annual Passes** including the Federal Senior Pass,
Golden Age Pass and Access Pass, are honored for entrance to the site. Tickets for tours of the St. Gaudens home, "Aspet", are free, and are available on a first come - first served basis only. Aspet tours are limited to 12 people at a time. There's no additional fee for the concert.
